Continuing the Productivity Conversation Green Paper

Chartered Accountants Australia and New Zealand (CA ANZ) welcomes the New South Wales (NSW) Productivity Commission's Green Paper entitled "Continuing the Productivity Conversation". Now more than ever, addressing Australia's sluggish productivity growth is critical to the ongoing welfare of both current and future Australian generations.

CA ANZ has a particular interest in the role of tax and regulation in helping Australia improve its productivity performance. CA ANZ strongly supports recommendation 8.1 in the Green Paper - the replacement of inefficient taxes with more efficient ones - and commends the NSW Productivity Commission for focusing on taxes within the control of the NSW government.

In a <u>submission</u> to the NSW Review of Federal Financial Relations regarding its draft report 'Supporting the Road to Recovery' CA ANZ expressed support for the two state tax initiatives recommended by the Productivity Commission in its green paper – namely harmonisation and broadening of payroll tax and the replacement of stamp duty with a broad based land tax. CA ANZ also expressed strong support for the abolition of insurance duties due to the significant moral hazard and economic inefficiencies associated with insurance duties.

From a regulatory perspective, CA ANZ has been working closely with the Federal Government in relation to the <u>modernisation of business registries</u>, <u>single touch payroll</u> and <u>myGov ID</u>. CA ANZ is also a strong supporter of the <u>National Business Simplification Initiative</u> which makes it easier for businesses to register at both a Federal and NSW level. Great alignment of definitions used at both a particular level of government and *between* various Australian governments and automated data sharing (with appropriate privacy safeguards) has the potential to reap great reductions in compliance, which hopefully translates to better productivity.

CA ANZ strongly encourages reviews of regulatory burdens to adopt an Australian-wide approach that looks to integrate existing economic infrastructure such as myGovID, single touch payroll, e-invoicing and the soon to be modernised business registers, rather than develop separate stand-alone structures.

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Encouraging small business to adopt and implement digitalisation reporting, especially financial reporting, is essential to help small business meet compliance obligations in a cost-efficient manner and allow them to concentrate on what their business operations¹.

Continued co-ordination between those States and Territories with a small business commissioner and a small business ombudsman, and the Australian Small Business and Family Enterprise Ombudsman, to educate small businesses about both the benefits of digitalisation and how to implement digitalisation cost effectively could, given the size of the small business sector, also make a positive contribution to Australia's sluggish productivity.

CA ANZ looks forward to working closely with NSW government officials to progress these issues.	If you
